## UGC SPONSORED TWO DAY NATIONAL SEMINAR – 2011

A two day national seminar on 'KERALA'S ECONOMY- TWENTY YEARS AFTER ECONOMIC LIBERALISATION' was held on 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of October 2011 under the aegis of the Postgraduate department of Economics. This was the fourth national seminar organized by the department since 2004. It was inaugurated by Dr. M.N. Sudhakaran, the former Head of the Department of Economics, St. Aloysius College, Elthuruth. Prof. A. O. Varughese, Principal, presided over the function. Dr. Sthanu R. Dr. B.A. Prakash, former Head of the Department of Economics, University of Kerala presented a paper on 'Gulf Migration and its Economic Consequences'.

On 13<sup>th</sup> October 2011, the fourth technical session was devoted for a deliberation on the Industrial Backwardness of Kerala. Dr. Balakrishnan Pulepra, Director, Centre for Development Studies, Thiruvananthapuram and visiting professor of IIMK and Oxford University dilated upon the topic 'Why Kerala Does Not Attract Much Industrial Investment'.

The valedictory session was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Mathai O.I.C, Principal, St. John's E.H.S.S, Kunnamkulam. Principal of the college, Prof. A.O. Varughese distributed certificates to the participants.
